#### NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT AN URBAN WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN AND HOLD A PUBLIC MEETING TO

## RECEIVE COMMENTS ON THE PROPOSED PLAN

## CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COMPANY'S DOMINGUEZ DISTRICT

California Water Code, Part 2.6 Chapters 1 through 4 (Sections 10610 through 10656), are known and may the "Urban Water Management Planning Act.

These California Water Code sections require all urban water suppliers that provide water for municipal pagdirectly or indirectly to more than 3,000 customers or supply more than 3,000 acre-feet of water annually to Urban Water Management Plan as cotlined and identified in those sections. This requirement applies to privately owned water utilities.

The plan must describe and evaluate sources of supply, reasonable and practical efficient uses, reclamation, a management activities. The components of the plan may vary according to an individual communit characteristics and its capabilities to efficiently use and conserve water. The plan must address measures for commercial, governmental, and industrial water demand management.

The act requires urban water suppliers to update their Urban Water Management Plans at least once every and to file updated plans with the Department of Water Resources, the California State Library, and any cit served by the supplier no later than 30 days after adoption.

California Water Service Company (Cal Water) is an investor-owned public utility providing water service California. In addition, Cal Water is regulated by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC).

One of Cal Water's service areas is the Dominguez District, which is located in Los Angeles County. The I District serves the City of Carson, a large section of the City of Torrance, small sections of the Cities of Com Beach and Los Angeles and a portion of Los Angeles County.

As a defined urban water supplier, Cal Water is preparing an update to its Urban Water Management Pla address the water service conditions in the Dominguez District. It is Cal Water's intent to adopt that plan a plan as required with the Department of Water Resources, the California State Library, and any city or con which Cal Water provides service.

A key focus of this UWMP update is the conservation requirement set forth in Senate Bill 7 (SBX7-7) a November 2009. SBX7-7 mandates a statewide 20% reduction in per capita urban water use by 2020, quantify the objectives and identify the means of achieving this mandated demand reduction, Cal Water to a Conservation Master Plan.

Cal Water is in the process of expanding current conservation programs and developing new program districts. Over the next five years, Cal Water conservation program expenditures are likely to increase, dimeasure to recently adopted state policies requiring future reductions in per capita urban water use. These st include SBx7-7, as well as recent decisions by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) direction and B water utilities to adopt conservation programs and rate structures designed to achieve reductions it water use, as well as the Memorandum of Understanding Regarding Urban Water Conservation in Californ of which Cal Water has been a signatory since 1991.

The Conservation Master Plan for the Dominguez District will be presented to the Cities, Counties and pu by Cal Water's Dominguez District in conjunction with the UWMP.

#### Schedule of upcoming actions:

On April 1, 2011, a copy of the Proposed Urban Water Management Plan and the Conservation Master Plan available for review during normal business hours at the Rancho Dominguez Gustomer Service Center, 263 Street, Tornatce CA 90505.
